What is a Forest Land Use Zone

A Forest Land Use Zone (FLUZ) is an area of land to which legislative controls are applied under the authority of the *Public Land Act*. A FLUZ is created specifically for that land base and the conditions that exist within it.

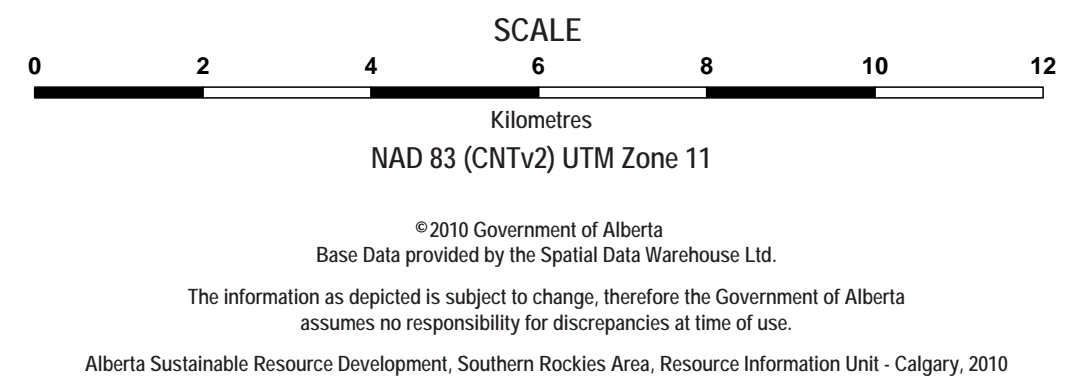
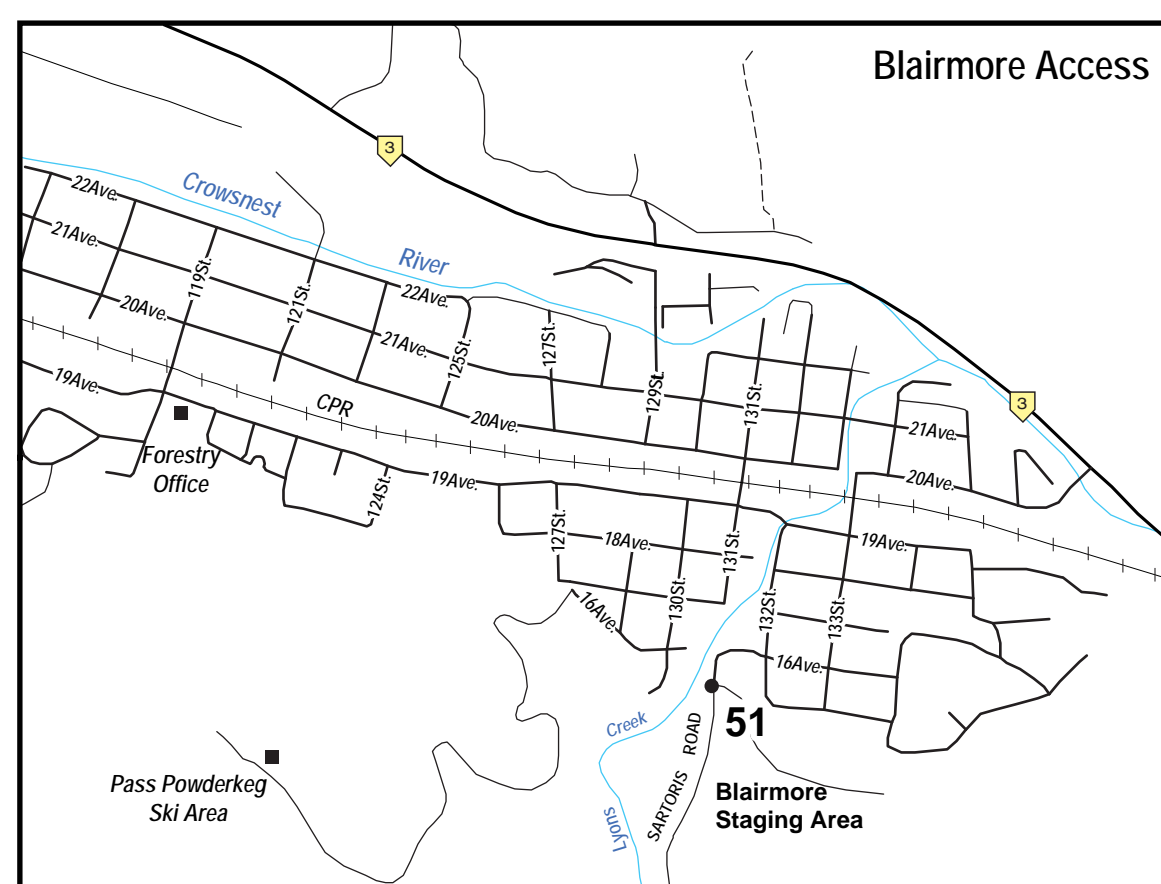
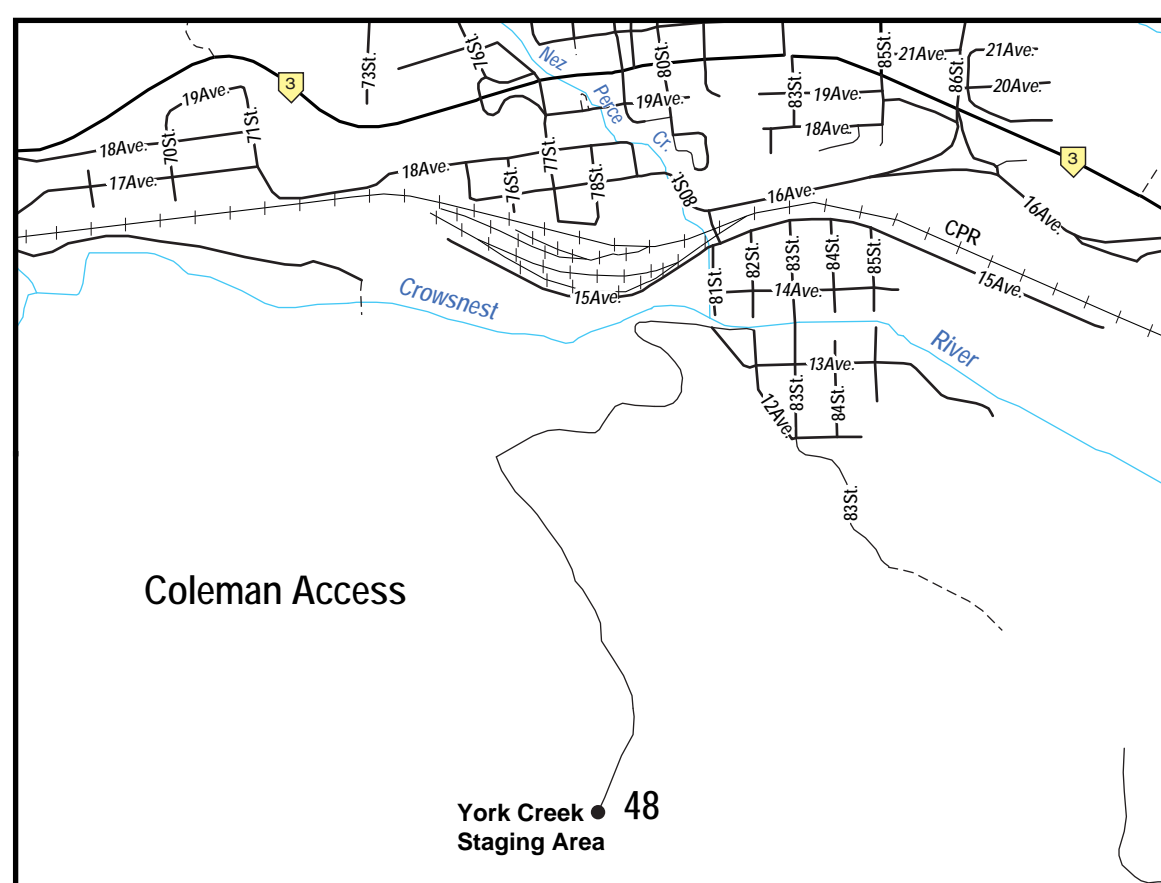
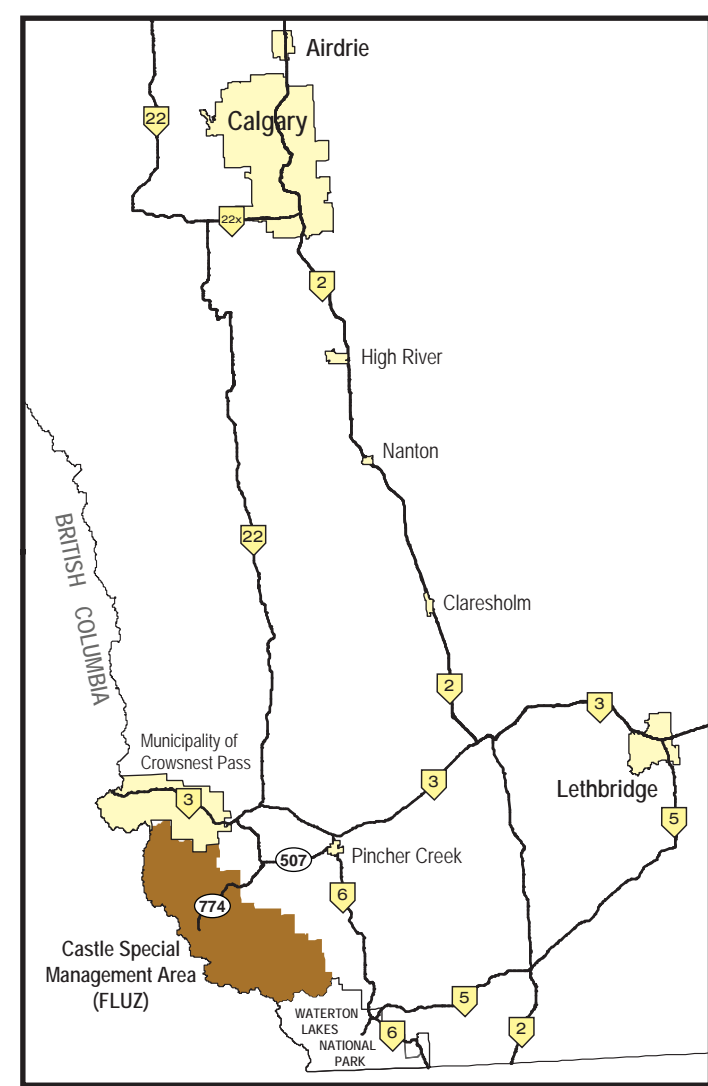
Forest Land Use Signs

Follow directions on signs as posted.

- directional arrow
- intersection marker number (corresponds with numbers on map)
- end of trail sign
- designated motorized summer trails
- designated motorized winter trails
